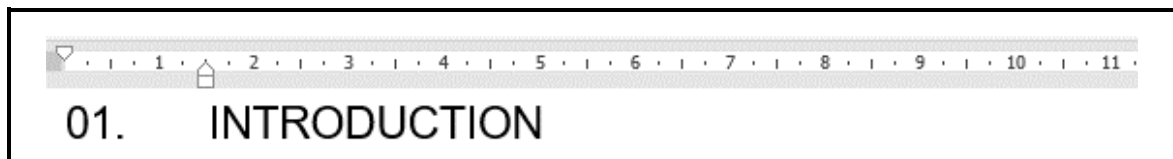
SCENARIO

KwaZulu-Natal offers many tourist attractions, such as beautiful beaches, mountains, world heritage sites and numerous game reserves.

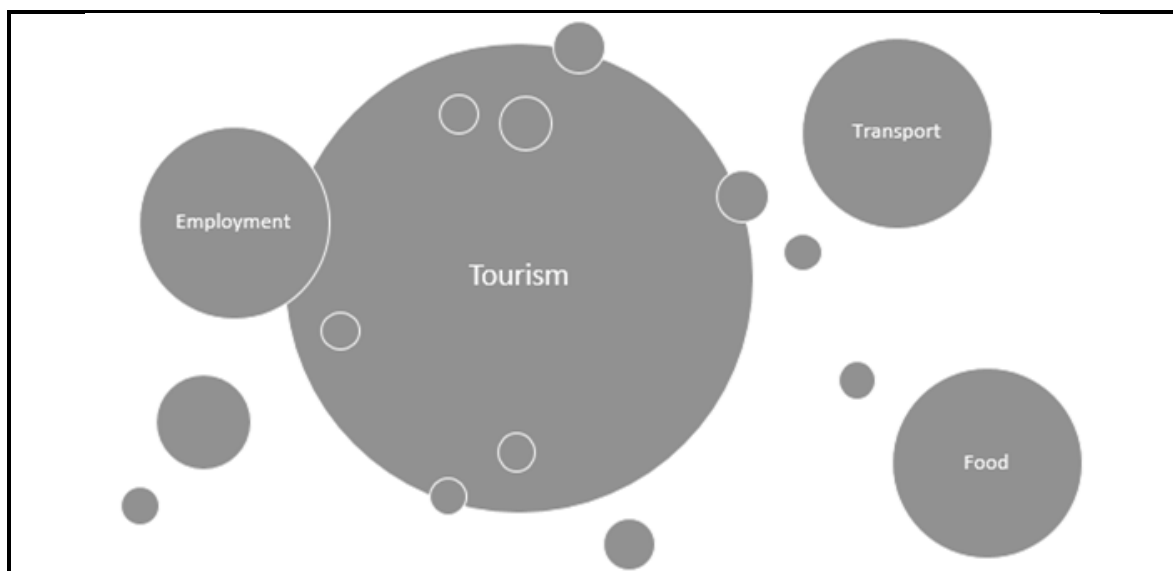
QUESTION 1: WORD PROCESSING

 - First gradient stop at the 60% position
- 1.3 Modify the style named Showcasting so that all the subheadings will display as shown below.



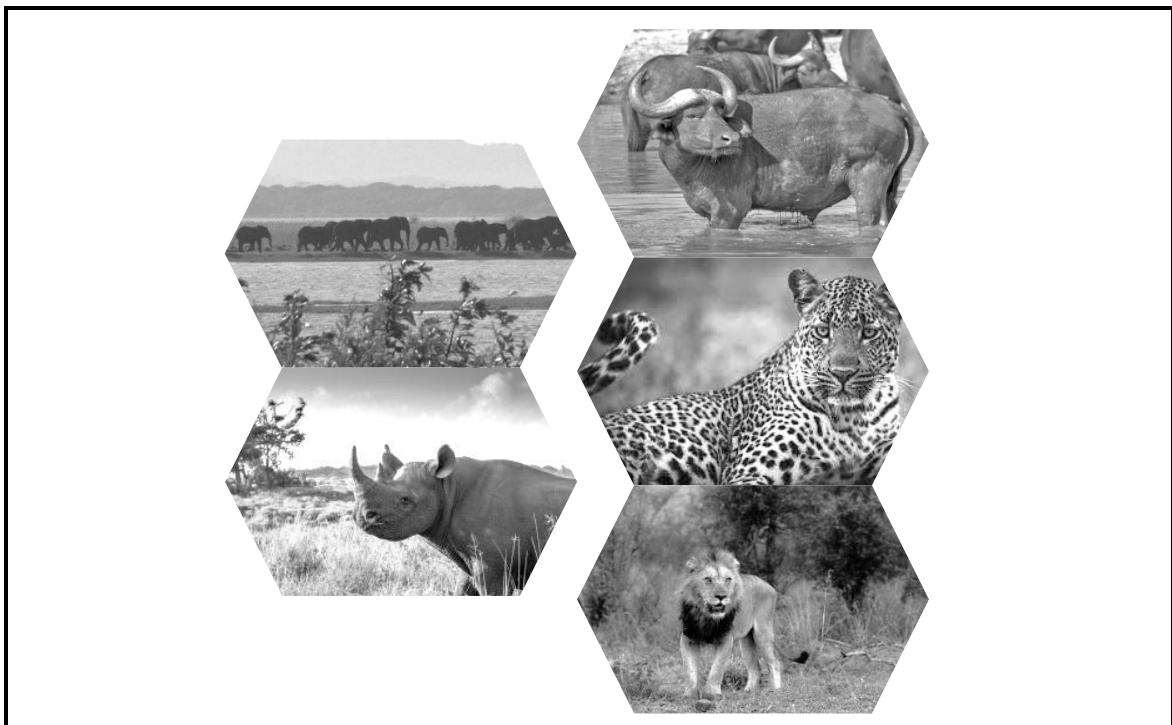
- 1.4 Find the citation in the third paragraph that refers to the '(Department of Statistics South Africa)'. (3)
- Convert the citation to static text. (1)
- 1.5 Find the text 'Question/Vraag 1.5' and replace it with a Circle Relationship SmartArt graphic as shown below.
- Format the font size of the text 'Tourism' to 14 pt.



- 1.6 Find and replace all occurrences of the exact word 'tourism' with a highlighted word 'tourism'. (2)
- 1.7 Find the text that starts with 'PUBLIC RELATIONS AND ...' and ends with '... effects of the pandemic.' and do the following: (2)
- Place the text in two columns.
 - Change the page orientation of ONLY this text to landscape.
- 1.8 Find the heading 'Pandemic' and mark it as an index entry AND add a subentry called 'Covid' to this main index entry. (1)
- 1.9 Insert a bibliography in the Harvard – Anglia bibliography style below the text 'Question/Vraag 1.9'. (2)
- 1.10 Insert an index below the text 'Question/Vraag 1.10' so that the page numbers will be right-aligned with a solid line tab leader. (3)

Insert a combination of functions in **cell G5** to display the total spending for the month (January) and which will leave the cell empty if any data is missing in that row.

Copy the function down to **cells G6:G16**.

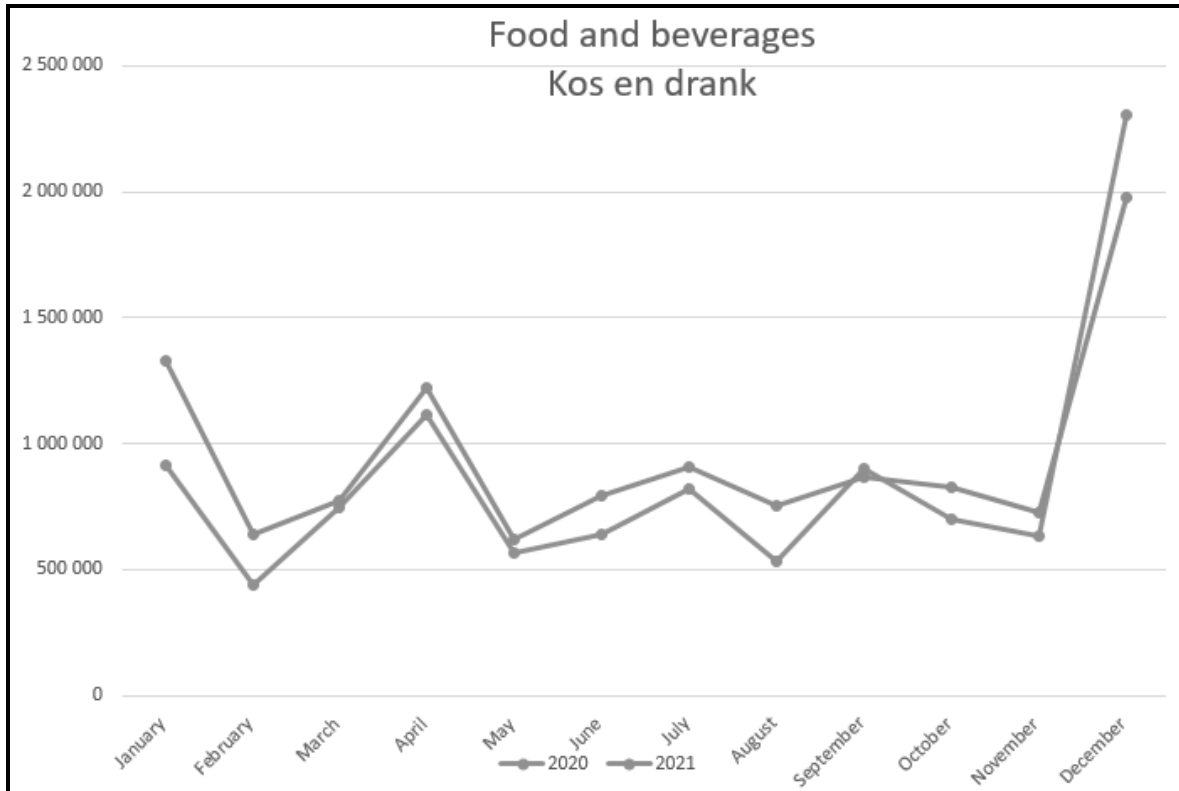

Open the **4Sightings** spreadsheet which contains information about lions seen on game drives at the Hluhluwe-iMfolozi Park.

Work in the **Lions** worksheet.

- 4.1 Insert a function in **cell D3** to determine the most lions seen on any game drive. (1)
- 4.2 Insert a SUMIFS function in **cell D4** to determine the total number of lions seen at the Mpila Camp (**column C**) where the sightings included cubs. (5)
- 4.3 Insert a VLOOKUP function in **cell A7** to display the surname of the ranger based on the ID of the ranger and the list in the **Rangers** worksheet. (3)
- 4.4 Game drives are classified as follows:

Part of day	Time of day
Morning	Start before 12:00
Afternoon	Start from 12:00 and end before 17:30
Night	Start from 17:30

- Insert a nested IF function in **cell D7** to classify the game drive time using the time in **cell E7** and the time of day in **cells J1:O3**. (6)
- 4.5 Each game drive lasts 2 hours and 45 minutes.
- Insert a TIME function in **cell F7** to display the time the game drive will end. (4)
- Save and close the **4Sightings** spreadsheet. [19]



QUESTION 5: DATABASE

The KZN Travel Agency keeps a database of all travellers to KwaZulu-Natal who book accommodation through a booking agent.

Open the **5Bookings** database.

5.1 Open the **tbl5_1** table in Design View and edit it as follows:

5.1.1 Change the field properties of the *Surname* field so that the field may not be left blank. (1)

5.1.2 Each traveller has a unique code that automatically links his/her details to the agency, e.g. h020530@tvI, a990522@tvI, etc.

Insert an input mask on the *MemberNo* field in the following lowercase format:

- First letter of the traveller's surname, followed by
- The date of birth as it appears in the ID number, followed by
- @tvI (4)

5.1.3 Change the field properties of the *TravelDate* field as follows:

- Apply the medium date format.
- Set the Date Picker so that it will not display. (2)

5.1.4 The *Accommodation* field should display options for accommodation types from the **tblAccommodation** table.

Edit the field properties of the *Accommodation* field to display the types of accommodation where tourists can stay. (1)

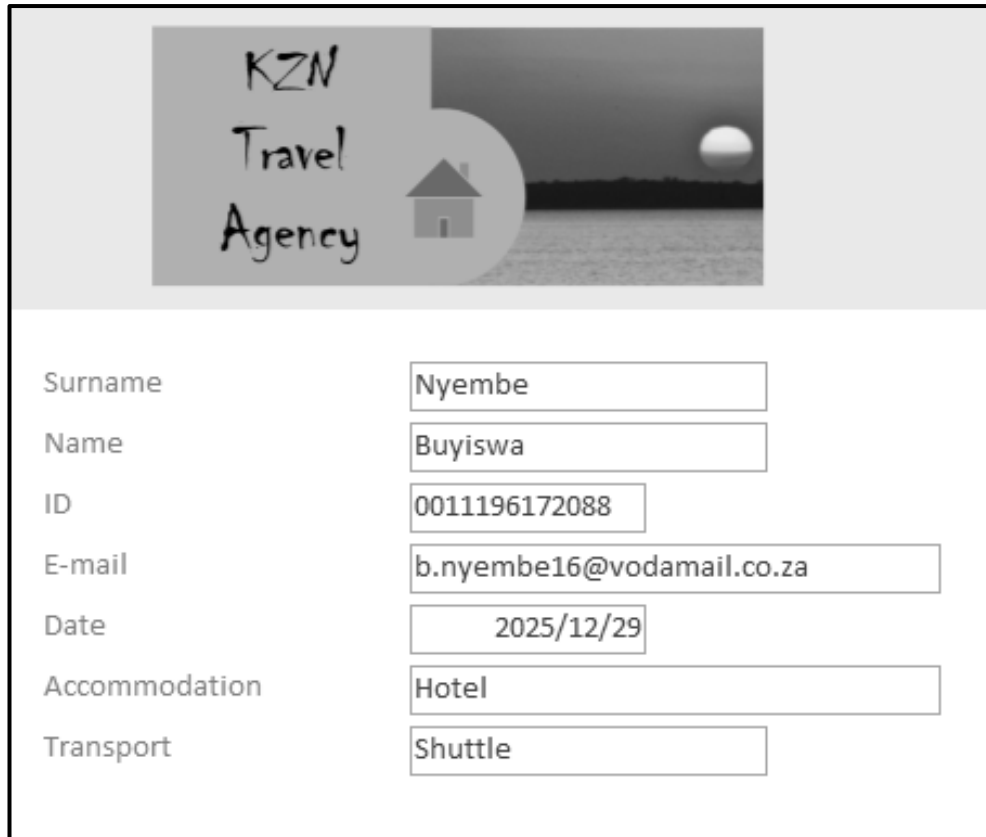
5.1.5 Insert a field named *IDCopy* below the *Surname* field that will link to a certified copy of an identity document. (3)

Save and close the **tbl5_1** table.



5.2 Open the **frm5_2** form, based on the **tblInfo** table, in Design View.

Display the total cost per booking agent.

5.5 Open the **qry5_5** query, based on the **tblInfo** table, in Design View.

The calculated field *Year* determines whether a traveller was born in the year 19.. or the year 20.. . DO NOT modify the *Year* field.

Insert a new calculated field *DOB* to combine the value in the *Year* field and the date of birth in the *ID* field to display as *yyyymmdd*, e.g. 19920731, 20051012, etc.

Save and close the **qry5_5** query.

5.6 Create a report called **rpt5_6**, based on the **tblInfo** table as follows:

- Display the *Surname*, *Name*, *GroupSize*, *Accommodation* and *Transport* fields.
- Display the total number of people per transport type in the group footer.

The Dolphin Coast refers to the Northern Coast of KwaZulu-Natal and is so named for the schools of Bottlenose dolphins that leap out of the warm waters of the Indian Ocean, to the delight of spectators. 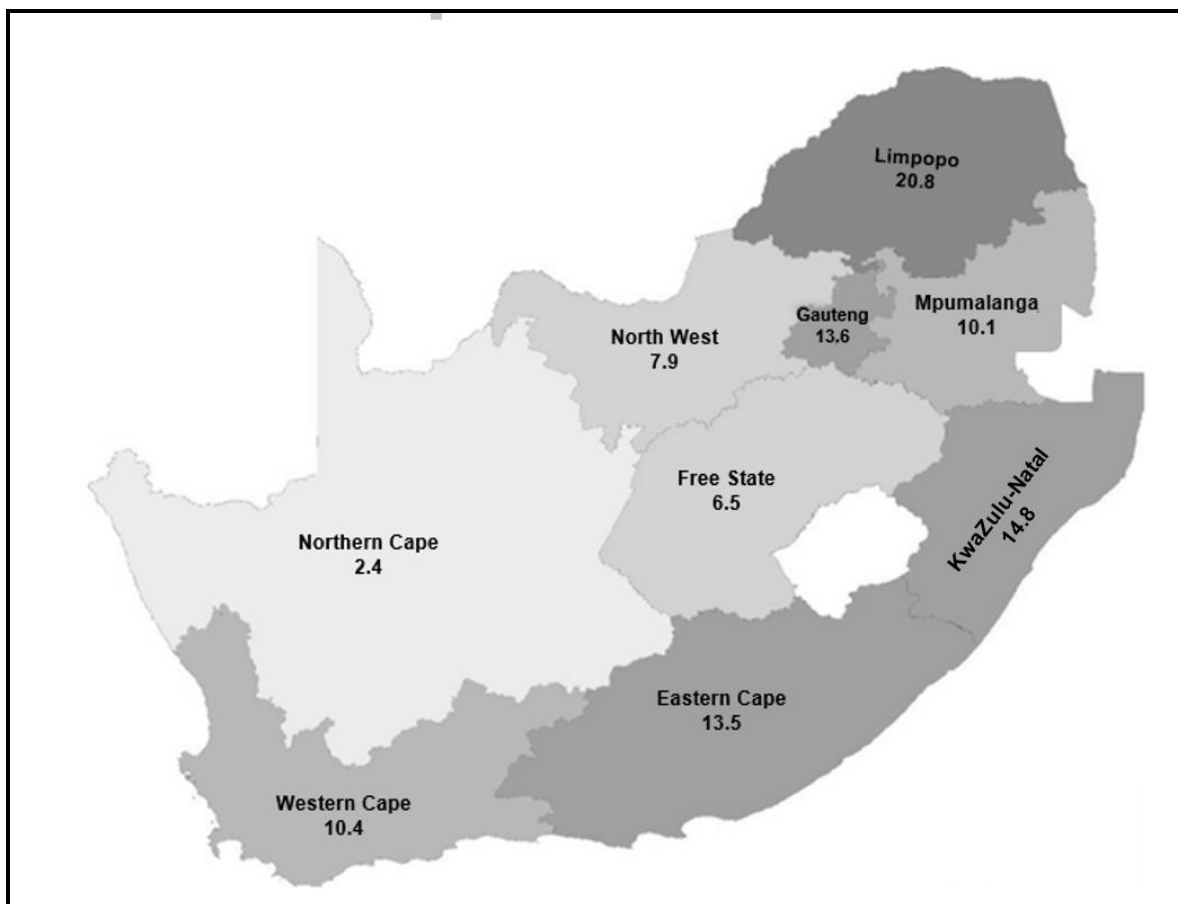
Tourism in KwaZulu-Natal contributes significantly to the economy of the country.

The KZN Travel Agency is running a competition to promote awareness of the Big Five animals.

As tourists see the animals within the week, it is recorded in **cells B2:H7**. Each animal seen can be recorded only ONCE during the week.

Determine whether a tourist has seen all the Big Five animals (**B10:B15**) at the end of the week, by using the following steps:

- The data in **cells I2:O7** will indicate whether each animal seen, is part of the Big Five or not.
- Use an **OR** function (*NOT an IF statement*) in **cell M2** to determine whether the animal in **cell F2** is a Big Five animal or not. Copy the function down to the other cells.
- Use a formula in **cell P3** to determine whether Bonakele saw all the Big Five animals.
